Dear Global Angels & GKN,

When I first arrived here in Guludo we were welcomed by a community that shared their water source with elephants, struggled to feed their children and their families for 4 months of the year and where no children went on to secondary school and not one family had any protection against malaria. We suspected that the statistic stating that 1 in 3 children didn't make it to their 5th birthday was conservative at best, the two main killers being water born diseases and malaria.

Now Guludo has a clean water source and approximately 10,000 pregnant women and children in the area are protected against the deadly bite of a malarial mosquito. With your help we are now going to be able to work with 11 further villages to drill new water points and fit new pumps on existing good water points. With Global Angel's help school attendance at Guludo Primary School has tripled with each of the 264 children receiving a nutritious meal at school. However, most importantly, now there is now hope for the next generation.

We have just named our charity Nema. This is a local word which perfectly describes what Nema is achieving; "nema" is the name for the type of joy that comes deep from someone's soul when suffering ends, forever. The funds you have donated will bring "nema" to approximately 12,000 people currently living in extreme poverty.

Words cannot express the gratitude felt for Global Angels and GKN. Our promise to you is that we will make sure every penny you have so generously donated to Nema projects will stretch as far as it possibly can and touch as many people's lives as possible.
